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PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION.

An Improved Locking Device, for Padlocks, and other Locks.

I, George Hunt Lamb, of 5, Vicarage Lane, Stratford, London, E. 15, an Englishman, do hereby declare the nature of this invention to be as 5 follows:-

A specially formed bolt operated by a spring, and having, as well as a central, two wing bolts, which on being shot home, pass through corresponding holes or slots, in the wall of the channel in which a gapped ring rotates, and engaging, and passing into a hole on either side of the central part of the specially formed bolt referred to above, and into corresponding holes at the ends of a 15 gapped ring.

COMPLETE SPECIFICATION.

An Improved Locking Device for Padlocks and other Locks.

I, GEORGE HUNT LAMB, of 5, Vicarage Lane, Stratford, London, E. 15, an Englishman, do hereby declare the nature of this invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, to be particularly described and ascertained 25 in and by the following statement:-

-This invention relates to an improved locking device for padlocks and other locks, or the like lock, of the type having a gapped annulus or ring as described in 30 28,871/12 forming the shackle which is secured by a bolt shot into engagement with the gap.

The accompanying drawings illustrate the invention of an improved locking 35 device.

Fig. 1, being a plan of the improved locking device in a padlock.

Fig. 2, showing the gapped ring, G.

Fig. 2, showing the gapped ring, G. Fig. 3, showing the specially formed 40 improved bolt, H.

The casing is provided with parallel guideways B, formed conveniently integral therewith, so as to carry the improved sliding bolt H, held in the 45 normal or locked position by pressure of a helical spring Q, and housed within a

recessed part of the bolt H, and against which said spring bears, an appropriate abutment N, for the spring serving to limit the travel of the bolt.

The outer portions of the bolt H, extends, as shown, across the pathway of a guided annular link G, whose continuity is interrupted at P, so as to form a gap into which the outer ends of the 55 bolt shoots, the improved form of this said bolt having a wingbolt L, added on each side, and shooting home simul-taneously with the central part of the bolt through holes or slots M, in the 60 guideways, and into and through corresponding holes or slots K, in the ring G, in the act of locking the device.

When it is desired to unfasten the padlock by rotation of the link G, the 65 spring operated bolt H, is withdrawn from the gap P, a suitable key turning about the pivot I, and engaging one or the other of the lugs J, in a manner well understood.

When the bolt is withdrawn and the shackle turned to release it from the staple, the bolt is held by the shackle in the withdrawn position, and the key

cannot be turned completely, and therefor remains imprisoned in the lock until the lock is again in the locked position.

Having now particularly described and 5 ascertained the nature of my said invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, I declare that what I claim is:—

1. A padlock or other lock of the type 10 in which a gapped ring or the like, is locked by shooting the end of a keyretracted, spring-shot bolt into the gap, characterised in, that the said bolt has side wings with extensions, one on each side of the bolthead for engaging recesses 15 or slots in the shackle in the locked position.

2. A padlock or other lock as claimed in Claim 1, in which the key is imprisoned in the lock except when the 20 lock is in the locked condition.

3. A padlock or other lock substantially as described and illustrated.
